The EU Liaison Office of Freie Universität Berlin in Brussels

- Head: Dr Charlotte Fiala
- Attached to the Vice President for Research (and the Center for International Cooperation)
- Established in 2009
- One of Freie Universität's seven liaison offices abroad
- Situated close to the European Parliament, DG Research & Innovation and national research liaison offices

Freie Universität Berlin – EU Liaison Office

The EU Liaison Office aims to:

- increase the visibility of the University in Brussels and Europe, highlighting its outstanding contributions to research,
- give strategic advice on European research funding for the University's professors
- bring together European policy makers with researchers of Freie Universität Berlin who can offer cutting-edge academic advice,
- support scientists and academics from Freie Universität in networking with colleagues from other European universities and research institutions,
- initiate and support alumni activities in Brussels,
- coordinate activities with the other international offices of Freie Universität.

Freie Universität Berlin: Raising awareness for social science and humanities

- Contribution of Freie Universität Berlin and others to the Greenpaper consultation in May 2011,

- December 2012: PGA: Partial General Approach of the Council of the European Union
 - Content agreed among Member States, no agreement on budget yet
 - Specific programme: Most important text for scientists at the moment, then comparisons with the EP text to be negotiated until the summer

Open questions regarding social science and humanities in other parts of Horizon 2020

 - SSH as an add-on or in the driving seat?
 - Share of SSH scientists in the advisory boards and other committees influencing the implementation of Horizon2020?
 - SSH researchers in the evaluation and review process

 - Doctoral networks with other socio-economic actors?
